AUCKLAND, 29th April. The appointment of Mr R. Penny Okaiawa, Taranaki, and Mr L. F. Rob ins, Temuka, as producers' representa tives on the New Zealand Honey Con trol Board, was announced to-day These appointments, together with tha of Mr W. Nelson, Otorohanga, as Gov ernment nominee and chairman, com plete the personnel of the new board members of which will take office in succession to Messrs J. R. Butland, F H. Hilary, and W. Watson, who re signed in protest against the Govern ment's policy for the marketing o honey.

Mr Penny is a prominent apiaris and for many years has taken a leading part in the affairs of the industry He is president of the Taranaki branch of the National Beekeepers' Association, and a past president of the national association. He will represen North Island producers on the board,

Mr Robins, who is well known in the industry in the south, has had wide experience in the production, pre paration and packing of honey. He is general president of the National Bee keepers' Association. As a member of the board he will represent South Is land producers.

The first meeting of the new board was held in Auckland this weekk, said Mr W. Nelson to-day. In close col laboration with the Internal Marketing Department members had made a thor ough investigation of the salient features of honey production and distribution in the Dominion. Constructive pro posals were brought forward for the reorganisation of both internal and export marketing. A complete state ment of the future policy of the board would be made at the annual confer ence of the National Beekeepers' As sociation, to be held at Timaru abou the first week in June.
